



The message of Divine Mercy is a powerful and moving way to come closer to Christ. Jesus promised a profound and immense grace to those who would celebrate this feast of His Divine Mercy. This grace is the forgiveness of all sins and the

### THE NOVENA FOR DIVINE MERCY

Begins on Good Friday, March 29th

Pray The Chaplet of Mercy as Novena beginning on <u>Good Friday (March 29, 2024)</u> and ending <u>Saturday after Easter (April 6, 2024)</u>. To do the Novena <u>read each prayer for each of the nine days, followed by praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet.</u>

Why? Because "the Lord specifically asked that (The Chaplet of Mercy) be recited as a novena, especially on the nine days before the Feast of Mercy. He promised, `By this Novena (of Chaplets) I will grant every possible grace to souls` (796)." (From Divine Mercy Novena and Chaplet pamphlet from Marian Press.)







Let's keep up the great work. Please save the date for our next blood drive. It is May 20th.




